CELEBRATED Chinese New Year to highlight Chinese culture at Szechuan 132. Participated in UNCW Intercultural Fest to raise awareness of Wilmington's sister cities.

HOSTED a lecture and dinner program on the impact of the Beatles on American culture in recognition of the 50th anniversary of the iconic British group's first performance in the US.

REPRESENTED Wilmington at the first US-China Sister Cities Conference in Washington, DC..

HOSTED a delegation from Barbados in honor of the tenth anniversary of the twinning agreement.. The delegation met with representatives of local government, UNCW. CFCC, the State Ports, ILM, the NHC Tourism Authority, and the Gregory School; in addition to touring the city and nearby beaches.

FACILITATED a tri-lateral exchange between Wilmington and secondary schools in China & Poland centered on math skills.
